Meyer concludes his paper with a brief reference to the question, already much discussed, as to whether the cysticercus produces its inflammatory effect by means of infectious germs which find an entrance with it, or by the irritating chemical action of the substances which it secretes. He adheres to the latter view, at least in the present case, and remarks in passing, that in his opinion the inflammation resulting from intra-ocular cysticercus is generally set up in this way. N.
